This program is to act as a rewarding incentive to community governments. It is to encourage members' hard work and dedication to service all year long. Such commitment will benefit themselves, residents, staff, and the community living environment at UNC. The Community Cup program is designed to strengthen community development, morale, and appreciation for the UNC residence halls.

NOTE: The Community Cup program is not to encourage extreme rivalry between community governments. This should be a friendly competition! If problems arise, they will be dealt with appropriately. Please help make this year even better than last year! Take pride in what you do! Have fun and good luck!

WAYS TO MAINTAIN COMMUNITY CUP POINTS:

1. PROGRAMS

<u>Social</u> Examples: pancake night, study break, coffee morning, recycling drives	25 points
<u>Educational</u> Examples: voter registration drive, presentation about what is and isn't recyclable	50 points
<u>Philanthropic</u> Examples: toy drive, blanket making for children's hospitals, blood drive	75 points
<u>Traditional</u> NOTE: Only two programs will be considered for traditional category points per academic year. If your community does not already have one established, you are encouraged to create a traditional program. This program must demonstrate the qualities for a long-term event and be approved by the Internal Affairs Officer.	100 points
<u>Reoccurring</u> To successfully earn double points, you must first inform the Internal Affairs officer that you are planning to hold a reoccurring program. **Please fill out a reoccurring programming form for these	If your community government hosts a consecutive program, you will earn double points . For example, if you put on the same social program every Tuesday night for four weeks, you will

events each time they occur**	receive 50 points for each time it is put on. Social is 25 pts x 2 = 50. There is a 10 consecutive program cap on double points. As part of RHA's new green initiative, recycling/composting drives will not be subject to this cap.
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2. PROGRAM BONUSES

<p><u>Academic Faculty or Professional Staff involvement</u></p> <p><u>Includes:</u> Professors, class teachers, student teachers, maintenance staff, the Dean, coaches, Student Government members</p> <p><u>Excludes:</u> Members of Housing offices, RAs, RHA Executive Board members, other governors, Community Directors, and on-campus living staff members</p> <p>NOTE: Points will only be given for up to <i>three</i> academic faculty or professional staff personnel per program. Academic faculty members' identification must also be submitted in the program report.</p>	25 points											
<p><u>RHA Information component</u></p> <p>These points will be added to a program that contains a RHA information table, booth, or someone speaking and informing residents about the RHA. The method of information or those who worked at the table or booth must be indicated on the program report to earn the points for this bonus. Involving distribution of the Rambler into the program also counts.</p>	25 points

No need to fill out a report, just contact the Internal Affairs Officer to let them know.</p>	Amount supplied	# of points awarded

<p align="center"><u>RA Partnership</u></p> <p>NOTE: Points will only be given for up to <i>five</i> RAs. An RA must do more than just give financial support or an additional set of hands.</p>	10 points per RA

4. PASSIVE PROGRAMMING

Programs that do not bring people together outside of their living space into a common area; May include voting on something for the community, fliers on residents' doors, and collections within the building for a cause. (i.e. Canned food drives.) The community will receive **50 points** and must be approved by Internal Affairs.

5. HALL SPIRIT ITEMS

Halls that produce Hall Spirit Items for the community will receive **200 points** for each project completed. A sample of the item must be shown to the Internal Affairs Officer in order for the item to receive points. Hall Spirit Items can include, but are not limited to, t-shirts, hoodies, bracelets, Nalgene, etc. **Note:** Mardi gras beads and crafts projects do not count.

6. PROGRAMMING EVALUATION GUIDELINES

Communities will receive **10 points** for filling out a program report in its entirety with complete, reflective answers at the discretion of the Internal Affairs officer.

7. RECOGNITION

Community Governments can earn points by submitting OTMs and having them win at different levels. OTMs are due the fifth of every month to NRHH. Send them via e-mail to nrhh@unc.edu, and cc the NCC for full credit.

Recognition points can also be earned for the following categories.

* **Note:** Recognition programming must be approved by the President or NCC for points. The NCC reserves the right to withhold OTM points if a submission is not deemed to be of an appropriate length or quality.

Each OTM submitted on time to NRHH	15 points
OTMs that win on the school level	20 points
OTMs that win on the regional level	30 points
OTMs that win on the national level	50 points
Recognizing an RA/member of community staff (non-OTM)	30 points
Recognizing a resident (non-OTM)	20 points
Hosting an appreciation event	40 points

8. MARKETING

Points will be given to communities for making efforts to market to their residents.

Making a Facebook event *Excludes weekly events, must be created at least 5 days prior to event date for credit	5 points
Listserv emails	5 points
Sending a FoodInMyHall text	5 points
Creating posters/flyers	10 points
Painting a cube	50 points
Miscellaneous	10 points

9. ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION IN RHA PROGRAMS

15 points will be awarded for each guest brought to a Board of Governors meeting.

* **Note:** To receive points, each guest must live in a residence hall. The guest is not required to stay more than two hours, if the meeting exceeds two hours. (180 point limit per semester)

Know that extremely detailed records of your hall points will be kept by the Internal Affairs Officer and they will be 100% accurate and fair.
